"Remembering the Edmund Fitzgerald" Special Event Station



SS Edmund Fitzgerald

On the weekend of Nov. 4th thru Nov. 7th, 2004 the Stu Rockafellow A mat eur Radio Society of Plymouth, Michigan will operate a special event station commemorating the sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald. The "Fitz" went down with her crew on November 10th, 1975 in a fierce storm in Lake Superior a few miles off Whitefish Point. This is the 29th anniversary of that terrible loss.

They expect to start operations shortly after 1700 UTC Thursday Nov. 4 and continue until 1700 UTC Sunday Nov. 7 using the special event callsign N8F. They plan to utilize 2 stations at the Point and 2 stations at Paradise, MI, 11 miles south of the Point. Primary target frequencies are 3860, 7260, 14260 and 21360 kHz. Secondary frequencies are 18160 and 28360 kHz. Most operating will be on SSB. Check the special event sections of the Nov. issues of QST, CQ and World Radio magazines.

A certificate is available to those who contact either station. More information is available at www.qsl.net/w8njh.



2004 Christmas Gift **Exchange Rules**

The gift exchange is open to all members and guests. In order to receive a gift, one must bring a gift.

Gifts should be useful items that have a value of \$10 or more. A gift can come from your junk box or can be purchased and should be radio or computer related.

Gifts should be wrapped in Christmas paper and need not have "to" or "from" tags or other identification on them. Be sure to remember which gifts you brought so you don't select your own gift!

If your spouse and/or children bring a gift, that will maximize your "take" from the exchange and may enable you to take home that "prize" gift that everyone covets.

Those that bring gifts will be asked to draw a number, which will determine the order of gift selection and opening.

The gift opening will proceed as follows:

Number 1 chooses a gift from the gift table, opens it, and MUST show it to everyone present.

Number 2 can choose a gift from the table or he can take Number 1's gift if he thinks that is a better gift than he could find amongst the unopened gifts. If number 2 chooses a gift from the table, he opens it and MUST show it to everyone present.

If Number 2 takes the gift from Number 1, then Number 1 goes back to the gift table and selects another gift, opens it and MUST show it to everyone.

Number 3 can choose a gift from the table, Number 1, or Number 2 and follow the same procedures listed above.

After all gifts have been opened, it is acceptable to trade your gift to anyone who is willing to trade with

Walk around and look over the gifts that are available for taking. Look at everything ... even those items that you have no intention of taking. The Radiotechnika Magazine contest team will be QRV as 5B/HA5RT/qrp from Limasol during the HA-QRP contest from November 2 to 9. Activity will be on 80 meters using 10 watts. Members will also be QRV as 5B/homecalls on other bands as well. QSL contest call via HA6NL and all others to home calls.

BHUTAN, A5.

A group of French operators are QRV as A52CDX until Nov. 11. QSL via F9DK.

THE GAMBIA, C5.

Jef, ON4ACA is QRV as C56ACA for two weeks. This includes an

entry in the CQWW SSB contest. QSL to home call.

BALEARIC ISLANDS, EA6. Tomas, LY1DF will be QRV as EA6/LY1DF in the CQWW SSB contest possibly as a Single-Op/All-B and or Single-B and entry. Look for activity before and after the contest on CW on all bands. OSL to home call.

MARTINIQUE, FM. Laurent, F5MUX will be QRV as FM5BH in the CQWW SSB contest as a Single Op/All B and/High Power or Single Op/All B and Assisted entry. He is active as TO7X before and after the contest. QSL via F5MUX.

THAILAND, HS.

Members of the Radio Amateur Society of Chumphon will be QRV as HS8AC/p during the Royal Plaque Boat Race and Hae Phra Festival 2004 at Laun Suan. Activity will be on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB, RTTY and SSTV. QSL via E21EIC.

ANTARCTICA. KC4AAA

Nick, NH6ON will be QRV as KC4AAA mainly on 20 meters from November 1 and December 15 while here on a communications systems engineering trip. Activity may be around 0100 to 0600 z. QSL to home call.

ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA, V2.

Team Antigua will be QRV as V26B during the CQWW SSB contest as a Multi/Two entry. Members are also QRV using their own calls before and after the contest on all bands, with special attempts at 160 meters and the newer bands, RTTY and

PSK31. They may also try some Satellite work on AO-7 and AO-51. QSL contest call via KA2AEV and all others via operators' instructions.

CHRIST MAS ISLAND, VK9X.

David, VK2C Z is QR V as VK9XD until November 4. He is active on 80 to 10 meters, and will participate in the CQWW SSB contest as a Single Op/All Band entry. QSL to home call.
